- 1. Competitors requiring an accompanist are requested to make their own arrangements.
- 2. Instrumental Duets, Trios and Quartets (Sections 500 -505) and Instrumental Solos (Sections 551 -582): Copies of music/scores must be submitted during Own Choice Weekend.

OWN CHOICE MATERIAL

All Own Choice Material must be submitted at the Mackay Eisteddfod Office, 39 Gordon Street, Mackay on the Own Choice Day:

Saturday August 5th 9am – 5pm

Competitors unable to submit Own Choice Material on these dates may forward their pieces by Registered Mail only to the Secretary, PO Box 350, Mackay QLD 4740 to arrive with mailing date no later than closing of Own Choice date as above. The Committee accepts no responsibility for non-arrival/receipt of Own Choice Material.

NO LATE OWN CHOICE SUBMISSIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED

During the Eisteddfod, the Chairperson, Penciller and Adjudicator will not accept any late material under any circumstances. No submitted material may be exchanged for a different piece or swapped between sections after 5pm on Sunday 5th August. Minor changes, e.g., shortening a music piece will still be allowed.

Own Choice material not received by 5pm on Sunday 5th August will result in the competitor being disqualified. The competitor may still perform and obtain an adjudication sheet but will not receive a mark or a placing.

Please note that all music pieces must be accompanied with a copy of the One Music Copyright Declaration form. (Do not attach copyright form to the music)

- 3. Instrumental Groups Sections 506 through to 521:
 - Scores for adjudicators must be submitted to the Eisteddfod office at the MECC on the day of performance, at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the Session. Scores must be in performance order in a clearly marked folder with the School Name and Section entered.
 - Standardised stage layouts have been adopted for Sections 508, 509, 510 511, 513, 514, 515, 516, 518, 519, 520 and 521. The layouts must be used by all groups competing in these sections unless prior arrangement has been made with the Eisteddfod Office. Please refer to the diagrams on the following pages for further details.
 - For all Instrumental Groups the Competitor Stage Layout MUST be submitted by email to the Head of Artform: Instrumental, Helen Williams hjwil0@eq.edu.au by 30th July
 - To reduce lengthy delays between competitors the order of performances in Instrumental Group sections (506 521) will not be balloted but will be determined by the Head of Artform or Stage Manager.
- 4. For School Ensemble Sections 506 through to 517 inclusive, ensembles must contain students who are all from the same school.

- 5. Repertoire chosen for Sections 519, 520 & 521 should be suitable for, and reflect the standard usually required for Open Sections. This would ultimately be at the discretion of the Adjudicator.
- 6. Repertoire chosen for Sections 500, 501 & 502 MUST be appropriate for a Duet. i.e. Written for 2 instruments, NOT solo one player per part.
- 7. Repertoire chosen for Sections 503, 504 & 505 MUST be appropriate with one player per part.
- 8. For sections 517 and 518 Ensembles may compete in either section 517 or 518. They are not permitted to enter both Sections.
- 9. For section 506 specifically, competitors will be permitted to play in more than one group. However, competitors must be playing a different instrument in each group.
- 10. For section 513 and 517 specifically, competitors will be permitted to play in more than one group. However, competitors must be playing a different instrument in each group.
- 11. All entries must clearly state the type of instrumentation on their entry form, i.e. (Djembe group, Clarinet Ensemble, Mixed Instrumental Group etc.). Competitors in sections 508-512, 514 & 516 are exempt from this.

IMPORTANT CHANGE: For all Instrumental Groups Sections 506 through to 521 scores for adjudicators must be submitted to the Eisteddfod office at the MECC on the day of performance, at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the Session. Scores must be in performance order in a clearly marked folder with the School Name and Section entered. The Competitor Stage Layout MUST be submitted by email to the Head of Artform: Instrumental, Helen Williams hjwill@eq.edu.au by 30th July.

Instrumental placements for Groups will be as per Stage Layout Plans.

Groups requiring a different layout may be asked to perform first or last at the discretion of the Stage Manager – requests must be made in writing for any variations to this layout to be considered (request and suggested layout to be submitted by email to the Head of Artform: Instrumental, Helen Williams hjwil0@eq.edu.au by 30th July.

In addition to the specified time 1 minute only will be allowed for setting and tuning

For section 506 specifically, competitors will be permitted to play in more than one group. However, competitors must be playing a different instrument in each group.

(5-12 students)

Own Choice

* Amplification of Bass Guitar/Keyboard bass line will be permitted
Percussion accompaniment allowed- max 3 players

Time Limit 4 mins
Conductor optional. No adult may appear on stage as an accompanist.

All groups in this section must state the type of instrumentation on their entry form, ie (Clarinet Ensemble, Mixed Instrumental Group etc).

508. Beginner Concert Band for Primary Students

(Min 13 students) Own Choice Time limit 4 mins Conductor optional. No adult may appear on stage as an accompanist. Students must be in their first year of learning. Ensembles entering in this Section are not permitted to enter section 509.

509. Large School Concert Band for Primary Students (School population over 400)

(Min 13 students)

Own Choice

Time limit 6 mins

Two pieces of contrasting style.

Conductor optional. No adult may appear on stage as an accompanist.

510. Small School Concert Band for Primary Students (School population under 400)

(Min 13 students)

Own Choice

Time limit 6 mins

Two pieces of contrasting style.

Conductor optional. No adult may appear on stage as an accompanist.

511. String Orchestra for Primary Students

(Min 10 students) Own Choice Time limit 6 mins

Two pieces of contrasting style.

Conductor optional. No adult may appear on stage as an accompanist

512. Recorder Ensemble for Primary Students

(5-40 students) Own Choice Time limit 4 mins Percussion **accompaniment** allowed, but percussion instruments are not

supplied for this section.

Conductor optional. No adult may appear on stage as an accompanist.

For section 513 and 517 specifically, competitors will be permitted to play in more than one group. However, competitors must be playing a different instrument in each group.

513. Small Group of Any Acoustic Instruments for Secondary Students

Excluding Percussion Ensemble. (5-12 students) Own Choice Time limit 4 mins Conductor optional. No adult may appear on stage as an accompanist.

514. Concert Band for Secondary Students

(Min 13 students) Own Choice Time limit 10 mins

Conductor optional. No adult may appear on stage as an accompanist.

515. String Orchestra for Secondary Students

(Min 10 students) Own Choice Time Limit 10 mins

Conductor optional. No adult may appear on stage as an accompanist.

516. Jazz Ensemble for Secondary Students

(9 - 20 students) Own Choice Time limit 8 mins

Two pieces of contrasting style/tempo.

Conductor optional. No adult may appear on stage as an accompanist.

For sections 517 and 518 Ensembles may compete in either section 517 or 518. They are not permitted to enter both Sections.

517. Percussion/Handbell Ensemble (tuned and untuned instruments) for Secondary and Middle School Students

(Min 5 students) Own Choice Time Limit 6 mins

Conductor Optional. No adult may appear on stage as an accompanist

518. Instrumental Group for "Middle Years" Students**

(Min 5 players) Own Choice Time Limit 8 mins

Conductor optional. No adult may appear on stage as an accompanist.

Ensembles must either contain students who are all from the same school or be a recognized, regularly rehearsing community ensemble.

^{**}For the purpose of the Mackay Eisteddfod, Students in this section MUST be in Year 10 or below.

For sections 519, 520 and 521, competitors will be permitted to play in more than one group.

However, competitors can play in no more than three groups within these sections.

Repertoire chosen for Sections 519, 520 & 521 should be suitable for, and reflect the standard usually required for Open Sections. This would ultimately be at the discretion of the Adjudicator.

Conductor optional. Repertoire to be suitable for an Open Section.

520. Small Group of any Acoustic Instruments Open

(5-12 players) Own Choice Time limit 10 mins

521. Large Group of any Acoustic Instruments Open

(Min 13 players) Own Choice Time limit 10 mins

Conductor optional. Repertoire to be suitable for an Open Section
